



This series in the primary Clark Trail is described on the preceding pages.

The series starts with a "push-off" half print made possible by the extended root.

Arrows indicate each of the five steps, starting in the lower portion of the photo.

Between the line marker and the arrow is the hole containing an extension of the *Lepidodendron* root which protruded eight inches into the substrate stone.



The arrow indicates a bit of the trench impressed in the clay by the root extension. One portion of the same root was depressed eight inches into the substrate stone, while another portion extended into the stone layer above. This polystrate context identifies the two stone layers as having a cyclical cause.

Encircled is the "push-off" print, showing deeper depression of the first and second toes.
