Any track worth after the 30's. No reason after
Bird came there. 1938. Passed a law
against removing tracks. Bird came & gov't appeared.
"They got me scared & I quit". - about 1938

Moved away from G.R. in 1950.

Worked as a team on the rock business.

Know Cliff Burdick? Yes, here at our house about 1950.

Replica of Cliff's work. Washed original rock.

Describes picture to John Holder, married older daughter.
12 tracks ready for sale, chained up for security.
Described some tracks at Jim's Place - Little
Colorado. - 5 yrs ago. He thinks they were combed.

Too perfect. No mud roll. 2 dips & 2 rises. Then
no borders. Somebody had combed some awfully good tracks.
Look very real.

Cliff's replica is spartal.

Is this ~~as good~~ worse or better than those we saw?

Holder's Cork track was just as good.

Some had big anchors, some small.

This (Cliff's) could be real. Would need to see rock to
see the compression rings.

Cut in their tray & chisel to find pressure lines.
Maybe 3" below track.

Very shallow tracks wouldn't show much compression.
Should cut ~~the~~ rock say 1 1/2" below track.

We went wider of track.

Holes in Cliff's rock from shells?

These little holes make me think it could be real.
