

The following forty-five photocopy pages of notes are herein published for the first time with the expressed written permission of the George Westcott family. George Westcott, M.D. traveled to Glen Rose, Texas for first-hand interview and observations relating to the reported "man tracks" among dinosaur tracks. His accounts, directives to his son, Bob, and transcribed taped interviews of the old-timers are herein reproduced as they appeared on the original paper on which they were written.

Dr. Westcott's candid expressions, written on stationery from the motels where he was staying after the trip to Glen Rose, reveal his expert opinion that the old-timers sincerely believed that they had observed genuine human footprints in the stone and that his observations verified their conclusions. His copious notes reveal details previously undisclosed to general public knowledge, such as the general location and date of excavation of the Burdick track, as well as his opinion as to its genuineness.

These notes are appropriately included in this survey of evidences.
